In Year 2, pupils will learn about the lifecycle of a plant and that plants need light, water and a suitable temperature to grow and survive. They will explore the four countries of the United Kingdom, identify them on a map and describe key physical and human features of each country. Pupils will have the opportunity to master their practical skills of cutting, grating and peeling through making a salad and learning about a healthy diet. In exploring heritage, identity and culture pupils will learn about muslims.		In Year 2 Children explore the life and times of Florence Nightingale 'Lady of the Lamp' and Mary Seacole. They will ask and answer questions about the past using artefacts, images, stories and other sources. They will be able to talk about the life and work of Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale and explain what they did to shape history. They will draw comparisons with modern nursing. Children Investigate light and seeing; naming a variety of sources of light, including electric lights, flames and the Sun, explaining that we see things because light travels from them to our eyes. Linked to their learning about light and dark, children will study and recreate the work of Vincent van Gogh's 'Starry night.'

In Year 2 the children will be able to name some famous explorers and will then learn how Christopher Columbus discovered a way to sail the world. Children will learn about the impact and legacy of his voyage, including that civilisations existed ahead of the 'discovery' of the 'New World'. In Science, the children explore the Earth, Moon and Space making links to the visual text, Baboon on the Moon which connects to their Design and Technology in which they design and make a form of transport for Baboon to travel on the surface of the moon.		Going Green in Year 2 will investigate the safari in Lower Zambezi National Park, which is home to a huge variety of animals, unusual plants, trees and the mighty Zambezi River. With an understanding of the structure of a variety of common animals, pupils will describe and compare the structure of animals that live there. They will explore and understand how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, how they depend on each other and understand why certain animals are endangered. They will use this as inspiration to create a t-shirt, applying the artistic techniques of printing and sewing.
