In D&T pupils will design and make their own puppets based on research and develop their cutting and joining techniques to enable them to construct their product. 



Spring 1 An Eye On London			Spring 2 Take One Picture		
During Spring 1 pupils explore their capital city using a variety of maps and images to develop their perspective The children learn about a range of London landmarks with historical, cultural and architectural significance and understand why they are so well known. They learn about some of the key features of London as a capital city. The children will construct lego models of their landmarks and in art they look at how landscapes have inspired artists before creating London landscapes of their own.		In this half term children in Year 1 explore the life of the Queen and ask and answer historical questions to develop their understanding of significant events in the recent past. In art the children explore portraiture and how people (including the queen) are represented in art. They will explore the work and techniques of Thomas Gainsborogh in contrast with digital techniques of Andy Worhol. They will create digital portraits of the queen and learn about the painting and colour techniques and effects used by Gainsborogh. In science children will identify, name and classify a variety of animals. Take one picture will also inspire their geography work as they explore the school grounds, using observation and photography to capture and map key features.

Children will explore how living life in the lighthouse can be so varied. Children will learn how the bravery of Grace Darling and her father on one stormy night in November 1815 highlighted the perilous life of seafarers and Lighthouse keepers. Linking to the fabulous series of books by David and Ronda Armitage, children will invent a new way of safely transferring Mr Grinling's sandwiches from his house to his lighthouse.			Oh I do like to be beside the Seaside! Children in Year 1 will explore the seaside and identify key human and physical features of a coastal area. They will use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the seaside and what people do there. As we are 'going green' they will also find out how to protect the area from pollution and preserve the wildlife on the coast and in our seas. The seaside environment will also provide inspiration for creating clay tiles - a souvenir of their seaside adventures! They will be taking a very close look at birds and developing their observation and sketching skills before creating bird sculptures
